Guest Speakers & Professors



Dr. Jon R. Lorsch, Ph.D.

Dr. Lorsch became the Director of the National Institute of General Medical Sciences (NIGMS) in August 2013. In this position, Dr. Lorsch oversees the Institute's \$2.359 billion budget, which primarily funds basic research in the areas of cell biology, biophysics, genetics, developmental biology, pharmacology, physiology, biological chemistry, biomedical technology, bioinformatics and computational biology. NIGMS supports nearly 4,550 research grants—about 10.5 percent of those funded by NIH as a whole—as well as a substantial amount of research training and programs designed to increase the diversity of the biomedical and behavioral research workforce.

Dr. Lorsch came to NIGMS from the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine, where he was a professor in the Department of Biophysics and Biophysical Chemistry. He joined the Johns Hopkins faculty in 1999 and became a full professor in 2009. A leader in RNA biology, Dr. Lorsch studies the initiation of translation, a major step in controlling how genes are expressed. When this process goes awry, viral infection, neurodegenerative diseases and cancer can result. To dissect the mechanics of translation initiation, Dr. Lorsch and collaborators developed a yeast-based system and a wide variety of biochemical and biophysical methods. The work also has led to efforts to control translation initiation through chemical reagents, such as drugs.

Dr. Lorsch is as passionate about education as he is about research. During his tenure at Johns Hopkins, he worked to reform the curricula for graduate and medical education, spearheaded the development of the Center for Innovation in Graduate Biomedical Education, and launched a program offering summer research experiences to local high school students, many from groups that are underrepresented in the biomedical and behavioral sciences. In addition, he advised dozens of undergraduate and graduate students and postdoctoral fellows.

Dr. Lorsch received a B.A. in chemistry from Swarthmore College in 1990 and a Ph.D. in biochemistry from Harvard University in 1995. Dr. Lorsch is the author of more than 60 peer-reviewed research articles, book chapters and other papers. He has also been the editor of three volumes of *Methods in Enzymology* and a reviewer for numerous scientific journals. He has one patent and one patent application related to his translation research. His honors include six teaching awards from Johns Hopkins.



Dr. Richard Marfuggi, M.D., FACS, DMH

Dr. Marfuggi is a Board Certified plastic surgeon with offices in New York City and New Jersey. After receiving his medical degree from the University of Vermont College of Medicine, Dr. Marfuggi worked at university hospitals across the northeast including New York University, the Eastern Virginia Graduate School of Medicine and the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine.

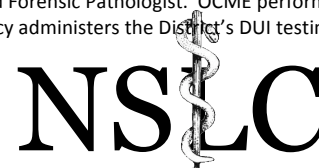
In addition to his work as a surgeon, Dr. Marfuggi holds a doctorate in Medical Humanities and has extensive experience teaching at Drew University, Rutgers University, the University of Richmond and Centenary College of New Jersey. He is also an Artistic Supernumary in the Metropolitan Opera. Dr. Marfuggi is a member of the AMA, the American College of Surgeons, and the American Society of Aesthetic Plastic Surgery; he serves on the Committee for Biomedical Ethics for the Medical Society of New Jersey and recently joined the Board of Directors for Lighthouse Guild International.

Dr. Marfuggi assisted in the development and continues to oversee the academic curriculum of the Medicine & Health Care Conference. He gives several interactive presentations during the course of the program focusing on 21st century medicine, emerging technologies, and medical ethics. Dr. Marfuggi also leads a hands-on clinical experience, introducing students to surgical suturing techniques.



Dr. Roger A. Mitchell, Jr., M.D.

Dr. Mitchell, who previously served as Assistant State Medical Examiner for the State of New Jersey was appointed by the mayor in 2014 to serve as the Chief Medical Examiner of Washington, D.C. As head of the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner (OCME), he oversees the agency's move toward accreditation under the National Association of Medical Examiners. Dr. Mitchell holds a bachelor's degree from Howard University and earned his M.D. from New Jersey Medical School. He performed his residency at George Washington University, served as a DNA Analyst at the FBI and is a Board Certified Forensic Pathologist. OCME performs more than 1,000 post-mortem examinations every year. In addition to this task, the agency administers the District's DUI testing program.

Dr. Paul M. Lisnek

Our speaker today has won several Emmys, Beacons, Tellys and Cablefax Awards for his work as a television anchor, radio host and author.

Dr. Paul Lisnek hosts “Politics Tonight” a LIVE television talk show seen in Chicagoland every weeknight on CLTV. He anchors “Newsmakers” on CNN Headline News, hosts “Political Update,” and “Broadway in Chicago Backstage” on the Comcast Network. Dr. Lisnek is the Political Analyst for WGN-TV appearing on its news programs. He has appeared as a legal and political commentator for NBC News on “Today Show” and “Nightly News,” on CNN’s “Anderson Cooper 360”, and M-TV.

Among hundreds of interviews, Dr. Lisnek has interviewed President Obama, Sir Elton John, Sting, Betty White, South Park creators Trey Parker and Matt Stone, David Schwimmer, Cyndi Lauper, Adam Lambert, Steve Carrel, Matt Damon, many senators, congressmen and governors.

Dr. Lisnek is also a regular guest host on WGN radio in Chicago, one of the country’s top talk radio stations. He appears as a newscaster in the film “Were the World Mine” and will also appear in the film “Heirlooms” and will be filming “The Haunted Laugh” later this summer.

Dr. Lisnek is the author of 13 books including “Quality Mind, Quality Life,” “Winning the Mind Game,” and “The Hidden Jury.”

Prior to his career in TV and radio, Dr. Lisnek was an assistant dean and professor at Loyola Law School in Chicago, taught at the University of Illinois, and Pepperdine University School of Law in Malibu.
